## MCLISTER STREET - Tomorrow, Friday 26 $^{\text {th }}$ May

McLister Street will not be accessible due to works being completed for the new traffic lights that will be installed at the intersection of McLister Street and Melbourne Road. We encourage families to plan ahead for tomorrow and consider parking across Melbourne Road and walking over at the crossing.

## REED STREET - Next week, Thursday 1 st June

We have also been notified that next Thursday there will be electricity pole replacement works undertaken in Reed Street. Reed Street will be closed all day from 7:00am - 5:00pm.
We ask that families be prepared to be patient at drop off and pick up times on these days as the impact of road closures can cause delays. Please also be mindful of safe driving and parking behaviours during these challenging times. It does feel like we are at the peak of the works at the moment and things will begin to improve as road works are completed in the coming weeks.


## Hobsons Bay Sewer Project - Assembly Presentation

Tomorrow at assembly we will welcome some visitors from the Hobsons Bay Sewer project. This project involves boring a new tunnel under the bay to connect two points and will be a long term project into 2024.

Spotswood Primary School students will be given the exclusive opportunity through a competition to name the boring machines. Our involvement will also enable students to hear from engineers about many exciting elements including machines, geology, tunnelling and the jobs it creates. The project has a predominately female engineering team and they are keen to promote STEM as a cool pathway for girls (and boys).

The project will also enable us to partner with Scienceworks in some workshops to test and design water literacy activities that will be available to the public through the exhibition opening in September.
