We are proud of our community, where everybody is somebody.


We acknowledge the Boonwurung people as the traditional custodians of the land we learn and grow on.







### **NAIDOC Week Poems**







## What's Happening In Our Classrooms


### **Prep/1 Classes – Narratives**






## 1/2 Classes - Reading





## 3/4 Classes – Werribee Open Range Zoo Excursion

Grade 3/4 students explored Werribee Open Range Zoo on Monday this week as an introduction to our new Unit of Inquiry: Australia and our neighbours. We participated in an education workshop at the Indigenous Garden where we explored native and introduced species. We had to identify four different animals by looking at a skeleton, skats, its food, a footprint and listening to its call and the indigenous name for each animal. Students had a great time on the safari bus where we saw some majestic giraffes eating hay from the back of a ute that was very close to the bus.

## 5/6 Classes - Inquiry

Grade 5/6 students have this week been *buzzing* about their new Unit of Inquiry, which explores electricity. We've been using circuit boards to create two projects: one in which students made a light flash, with the inclusion of a resistor to ensure we don't overload the circuits; and another in which students added a buzzer to their flashing light circuit. Students also experimented with creating homemade switches, and finished by writing procedural texts explaining how to build their projects.
