

Year 1/2 Classes – Numeracy (Week 2)



Year 3/4 Classes – Writing (Week 1)

The Year 3/4s have started the term by using a sensory walk and sensory objects to inspire their writing. We generated descriptive phrases and rich vocabulary to describe our experiences through sight, smell, touch, taste and sound. Students were then asked to create a short story using the descriptive language created in the sensory writing exercises. It was impressive to see students push themselves out of their comfort zones, facing the challenge of using their imagination and vocabulary in a different way.

Year 3/4 Classes - Inquiry (Week 2)

Grade 3 and 4 students have enjoyed exploring for our new Inquiry Unit: May The Force Be With You. 




Year 5/6 Classes – Inquiry (Week 2)

This week the 5/6 cohort launched into their new unit of inquiry about Disasters with a focus on understanding that sudden geological changes or extreme weather conditions affect the Earth's surface. The students were excited to experience a hands-on inclusion delivered by the Melbourne University 'Engineers Without Borders' team that provided an opportunity to think about safe structures and considerations for designs in disaster prone areas. The workshop offered an experience for the students to plan, build and test a structure against a flood, a cyclone and an earthquake using basic materials.
