
World Teachers' Day


Prep/1 Classes - Smart Spelling (Week 3)







Year 3/4 Classes & Year 5/6 Classes – Swimming Program (Week 3)

This week the Years 3-6 have been taking part in an extensive swimming program at Sunshine Leisure Centre. The sessions and activities themselves have been differentiated to cater for individual students' capabilities and needs.

Students have been learning various strokes including survival backstroke, as well as diving and general water safety. Thursday's session consisted of survival training where students were required to enter the pool in their civilian clothes, simulating an emergency situation, and refining how best to manage the conditions. They not only practised ensuring their own safety, but also that of their peers.

This was a fun and challenging activity that was extremely rewarding. It has been wonderful to see the growth in confidence throughout the week, and enjoyment being had by all.

Year 3/4 Classes – Inquiry (Week 4)

This term for inquiry we are learning about Forces. During this week we have engaged in 3 experiments exploring gravity. We explored finding the centre of gravity, bouncing balls and measuring elasticity. We used icypole sticks, pipe cleaners and washers to explore finding the centre of gravity. By adjusting the pipe cleaner and washer position we were able to make the stick stand upright on the tip of our fingers.

Year 5/6 Classes – Reading (Week 4)

Our 5/6 students have spent this week's Reading lessons thinking about how they can be more inquisitive readers. Using our mentor text, 47 Degrees, as well as independent reading books and Book Club texts, students have explored what it means to ask deep, meaningful questions with a view to expanding their comprehension skills. We have also spent time this term exploring the value of talking about reading, and how bouncing ideas off other readers can both increase comprehension and enhance our enjoyment of literature.


