Year 3/4 Classes - Writing

In the last few weeks, the 3/4 students have been writing and re-writing to create engaging narratives. Our focus has been on improving our reader experience through interesting vocabulary, figurative language, sensory language and engaging openers. Using the VCOP Pyramids (vocabulary, conjunctions, openers, punctuation) students peer reviewed each others' writing, and created goals for improvement. 
