We are currently putting together classes across the rest of the school and during this process students will spend some time in mixed activity groups. Classes will not be finalised until Step Up Day where students will have a session with their 2024 class and teacher on Tuesday 12th December.

We acknowledge that this time can bring a mixture of excitement and uncertainty for students and families and we want to reassure you that this is a complex process we take very seriously and spend a lot of time on. We are endeavouring to make the best possible placements for *all* of our students so that classes have a balance of social and academic profiles.

Students were able to nominate 5 learning partners that they work well with and we ensure that everyone will have at least one of these partners in their class next year. Moving into new class groups also provides the opportunity to explore new friendships and learning partnerships.





