Year 1/2 Classes – Poetry

Throughout Week 9, the Grade 1/2 's have been continuing to focus on poetry in writing. This week students had a go at creating rhyming poems. Before beginning our poems, the students brainstormed as many rhyming words as they could as a foundation to begin drafting. After gathering the concept of adding rhyming words to the end of each line students began drafting their pieces. The students spent time editing and correcting their poems, experimenting with different punctuation too!

Year 3/4 Classes – Mathematics – Reasoning Skills

During our warm ups in Mathematics lessons we have been practising using our reasoning skills. One way we have done this is through providing open-ended prompts such as 'Which one is the odd one out?' Students have had the opportunity to verbalise their reasoning skills through activities such as snowballing and concentric circles. Snowballing asks students to explain their thinking to a partner, then join up with another pair, then join up as a group of eight to share their ideas. Concentric circles ask the students to make an inner and outer circle facing each other and share their thinking with the person opposite them. It has been rewarding to see students all have an opportunity to explain their thinking as opposed to giving an answer. How many answers can you find for the examples below?



Year 5/6 Classes – Mathematics – Measurement and Geometry

This week the Year 5/6s commenced a new Mathematics unit within Measurement and Geometry, focusing on Length. The learning began with exploring the appropriate unit to measure the length of an object – where students practised measuring and recording objects around the classroom. As the week progresses, so too do the investigations including activities on measuring perimeter, converting between units, and recording using decimal representations. The students really enjoy the experiential nature of Measurement and Geometry units, embedding their knowledge through hands-on activities.



Specialist – Visual Art

This project involved students to come up with a simple fruit or vegetable design with two colours to create a lino print from. Students began their initial ideas in their visual diary and once a design was confirmed, they traced this on tissue paper and transferred their design onto soft carve lino. Students were taught how to use lino carving tools safety to carve the first step in their design. Once their first print was complete, they continued the carving process followed by a second colour print over the top.

Students were given black paper with a window cut out where they mounted and signed their own work. They did a brilliant job and their art looks very professional.
