Prep - SMART Spelling

In Prep this week we have been exploring the sounds /t/, /a/ and /p/ in our focus word 'tap'. We have been talking in our classrooms about what a tap is, why we use it and how it helps our lives. We have also explored the different meaning of tap as in when we tap something to make a sound, such as tap our fingers, tap on the table etc. We read a story called 'Tip Tap' about a crab who 'tip taps' out of her rockpool to go exploring. The students created an art piece from the story with the extra added challenge of only being able to use paper, scissors and glue. No drawing! Students also then had a go at writing 'tip tap'. Finally, we investigated why technology changes and how it helps us in our lives! We wonder if you can recognise some of this technology and even take a guess at how old it might be?!













