#### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN - The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy is a series of assessments that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only *national* assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake.

As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards.

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

# Vaping

It was brought to my attention recently that there have been some occasions where parents have been vaping on school grounds before and after school, and during assembly.

Parents, carers, schools, and community all play an important role in protecting children and young people from, and educating them about, the harmful effects of smoking and vaping.

Research from the <u>Royal Children's Hospital</u> shows many parents and carers are not aware of the harmful effects or how their views about smoking and vaping can impact the likelihood of a young person taking up smoking or vaping.

# **Vaping Is Not Permitted On School Grounds**

- In Victoria, a person must not smoke or vape on school premises or within 4 metres of any pedestrian access point to school premises.
- The prohibition on smoking includes vaping and applies whether or not the e-cigarette contains nicotine.







# What are your kids breathing in?

Vapes can have addictive nicotine, toxic metals and many different chemicals

Vaping can cause vomiting, nausea, coughing, shortness of breath, mouth irritation and asthma


# What's Happening In Our Classrooms


#### Year 3/4 - Inquiry - How Can You Make Your Voice Heard?


#### Tee Ball Boys & Girls
